


# NEXT STEP 2017 DESTINATIONS OF 2016 YEAR 12s Trinity Anglican School



## Introduction

This page presents a summary of results of the annual *Next Step* survey for Trinity Anglican School. The *Next Step* survey, undertaken by the Queensland Government, targets all students who completed Year 12 and gained a Senior Statement in 2016, whether they attended a state, Catholic or independent school, or a TAFE secondary college. The Queensland Government Statistician's Office conducted the survey between March and June 2017, approximately six months after the young people left school. Responses were collected online and via computer-assisted telephone interviewing.

## Response rate for Trinity Anglican School

Table 1 below reports the response rate for Trinity Anglican School. It expresses the number of respondents from this school, as a percentage of all Year 12 completers who attended Trinity Anglican School in 2016.

It has not been possible to ascertain how representative these responses are of all Year 12 completers from this school.

## Definitions of main destinations

The pathways of Year 12 completers were categorised into ten main destinations. Year 12 completers who were both studying and working were reported as studying for their main destination. ## Summary of findings

In 2017, 70.2% of young people who completed Year 12 at Trinity Anglican School in 2016 continued in some recognised form of education and training in the year after they left school.

The most common study destination was Bachelor Degree (63.8%). The combined VET study destinations accounted for 6.4% of respondents, including 2.1% in campus-based VET programs at Certificate IV level or higher.

4.3% commenced employment-based training, all as trainees.

In addition to the above study destinations, a further 14.9% of respondents from this school deferred a tertiary offer in 2017 (deferrers are included in their current destination).

29.8% did not enter post-school education or training, and were either employed (19.1%) or seeking work (10.6%).
