Students are given opportunity through many activities, clubs and competitions, to extend and develop their academic skills in preparation for secondary school. These opportunities are available to students outside of the Australian Curriculum and take place during breaks, before or after school.

Here's the answer - become an Avionics Pilot! Learn to fly and code a TELLO Drone. This course will cover safety aspects of recreational drones, use of manual and first person view flight controls and even teach students how to code their drone for autonomous flight.

- **6. Service -** Living out a spirit of service in the opportunities of everyday life, to provide for the needs of others and take social action.


