## ***BEGINNERS CHESS***

Chess develops memory, improves concentration, develops logical thinking, promotes imagination and creativity, teaches independence and develops the ability to think strategically. The da Vinci Decathlon began in 2002 as an offshoot of the very successful da Vinci Program for gifted and talented students at Knox Grammar School in Sydney. The Decathlon is designed to celebrate the academic gifts of Australian students by providing a stimulating and challenging competition run in the spirit of an Olympic Decathlon.

The da Vinci Decathlon is an academic competition; designed to challenge and stimulate the minds of school students. During the competition, students compete in teams of eight across 10 disciplines: engineering, mathematics and chess, code breaking, art and poetry, science, English, ideation, creative producers, cartography and general knowledge.

Students participating in this elective work on challenges to prepare them for the da Vinci Decathlon at St Joseph's College at Nudgee in May. Only open to selected students in Years 5 and 6.
